#### Jesus Is Alive! Celebrate Easter! by David C. Mauldin

Jesus Christ is alive! This is our hope and the strong to keep following him and calling him the Messiah. foundation of our faith. On Easter Sunday we celebrate Later on, when Christianity spread beyond Judaism to the Resurrection of Jesus. But Easter is not just a day. It is a season that stretches seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. I invite you to join our celebration.

Easter ranks first among holidays because nothing makes a greater difference than the Resurrection. To put it bluntly, if God did not raise Jesus from the dead, Christianity is bankrupt, worthless, a waste of time. But, if God did raise Jesus from the dead, then...Jesus is Lord, death is not the end, and you can find new life in Jesus alone.

preaching on the Resurrection. On Easter itself, I will preach about what the Resurrection means. The next Sunday is Thomas Sunday. (Yes, I made that up. The power to make up holidays is one of the most fun parts of my job.) You may recall the disciple Thomas doubted the Resurrection until he saw the risen Jesus. On Thomas Sunday, the sermon is about evidence for the Resurrection and why you should believe it really happened. The following Sunday doesn't have a special name, but I will preach about Resurrection hope and eternal life.

Here is a little golden nugget I won't be able to fit into my sermon on Thomas Sunday: Beginning in the 19th century, skeptics began to claim that belief in Jesus' Resurrection was a late addition to Christianity. They argued that Jesus' first disciples never believed or preached the Resurrection. For some unfathomable reason, when Jesus was crucified, these disciples decided

the larger Greek culture of the Roman Empire, some nut invented the idea of the Resurrection. That's what the skeptics said, basically. Never mind that Greek thought rejected the concept of Resurrection while many Jews believed in it. Anyway, the argument was that the Resurrection accounts in the gospels were invented later on. But there is a problem with that theory. OK, there are lots of problems with it, and no serious scholar argues this today.

One vital bit of evidence comes from Mark 16:2, Over the first three Sundays of Easter, I will be which in the ESV reads, "And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb." That's a fine English translation, but Mark did not actually write "the first day of the week." In the original Greek, he wrote, "the one of the Sabbath." That sounds weird in English. It also sounds weird in Greek. So why did Mark write that? He could have written "the first day of the week" in normal, everyday Greek. Why such an odd phrase? It is not natural Greek, but it is idiomatic Aramaic! Aramaic was the language spoken by Jews in Palestine. It is the language of Jesus and his first disciples. Mark used this Aramaic expression because it had been handed down to him in the oral tradition. In other words, Mark's account of the Resurrection goes back a long way, back to the time of Jesus' first followers. It is far too early to be a later invention.

Last year, 4Cs provided clothing to over 5,000 children in Martin County; our group donated almost 400 complete outfits to the program. Store volunteers told me that when our outfits are hanging on the racks at their store, people immediately migrate to them and snatch them up for their children. Your generous donations of fabric, notions, and money make it all possible as we are entirely dependent on those contributions to be able to make our clothing.

**Effective Teaching** – Trained teachers highlight and illustrate the central idea of the Bible passage and its practical application in each person's life.

**Insightful Commentary** – Respected theologians help participants understand the historical context of the passage and how it relates to the rest of Scripture.

**Caring Community** – Caring leaders pray for and encourage participants to grow spiritually and connect with each other in a loving and supportive community.
